

**CHAPTER 5**  
**WATERSHED DEVELOPMENT**

- 4-5-1 Preamble
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**§4-5-1: PREAMBLE:**

The President and Board of Trustees of the Village hereby find the facts as stated in Article I of the LCWDO to be true and correct and said findings are hereby made a part of this Chapter and part of this Code. (Ord. 2007-001, 1-15-2007)

**§4-5-2: LAKE COUNTY WATERSHED DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE ADOPTED:**

The Lake County Watershed Development Ordinance (referred to herein as the “Watershed Development Ordinance” or as the “LCWDO”) as most recently amended by the County of Lake on June 11, 2013, is hereby adopted by reference as if fully set out herein and is in full force and effect within the Village of Tower Lakes. The LCWDO is found in its own compilation on file in the Village Clerk’s office, and three (3) copies of said LCWDO have been on file in the Village Clerk’s office for a period of not less than thirty (30) days prior to the effective date hereof. **§4-5-3: CONFLICT:**

Should a conflict exist between this Chapter and any other ordinance of the Village, then the more restrictive provisions of any applicable ordinance shall prevail and apply. (Ord. 2007-001, 1-15-2007)

**§4-5-4: PENALTIES:**

- (A) Violation: Any person who shall be found guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction of violating any provision of this Chapter or of failing to comply with any approval or condition of approval, issued under the provisions of this Chapter, shall be guilty of a petty offense, punishable by a fine as specified from time to time in Section 1-4-1 of this Code for each offense, and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.
- (B) Court Costs: Any person who shall be found guilty by a court of competent jurisdiction of violating a provision of this Chapter or of failing to comply with any requirement thereof, or of violating any permit, any approval, or any directive under the provisions of this Chapter shall, in addition to the fines provided, be obligated to reimburse the Village for its attorney fees, court costs, court reporter costs, and expert witness fees, and all other out of pocket costs incurred by the Village in the prosecution of the said violation or violations.

(C) Injunction: The Village may make application to the circuit court for a temporary restraining order and/or a preliminary and/or permanent injunction requiring conformance with this Chapter or make such other order as the court deems necessary to secure compliance with this Chapter.
