**§8-6-1: PERMIT REQUIREMENTS:**

No person shall connect or suffer or permit a direct burglar or fire alarm connection from any building, place or premises to a receiving station owned or operated by the Village without first obtaining a permit from the Tower Lakes Police Department, approved by the Chairman of the Police Committee.

- (A) No permit shall be issued except upon written application to the Chairman of the Police Committee.
- (B) Said application shall be in a form prescribed by the Chairman of the Police Committee and shall contain the provision that the Village shall not be liable for any failure of service or any damages that might result from the installation or operation of the alarm system.
- (C) All applicants must, and shall, by accepting such permit, agree to indemnify the Village for all claims, demands, judgments, liability, costs and expenses including reasonable attorney fees, that might arise in any way as a result of the alarm connection and service.
- (D) All applicants must certify that alarm system maintenance will be provided twenty four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week.

**§8-6-2: MAINTENANCE OF ALARM SYSTEM; FALSE ALARM SERVICE FEES:**

A subscriber who fails to maintain or to secure maintenance for his alarm system properly shall pay a service charge for abuse of the alarm system. Two (2) false alarms due to human error or mechanical malfunction shall be allowed in any one calendar year without such charge. A false alarm service charge of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) each shall be billed to the subscriber for the third and fourth false alarms in any one calendar year and five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each false alarm thereafter in the same calendar year.
