

CHAPTER 2
STOPPING, STANDING OR PARKING

§9-2-1: ALL NIGHT PARKING:

No automobile or other self-propelled vehicle shall be parked within any part of the traveled portion of the right-of-way of any road, street or highway within the Village between sunset of any day and sunrise of the following day except for automobiles and other self-propelled vehicles of bona fide guests of a property owner located within two hundred feet (200') of said parked automobile or other self-propelled vehicle. (Ord. 67-12, 2-20-1967)

§9-2-2: PARKING DURING SNOWFALL:

No automobile or self-propelled vehicle shall be parked within any part of the traveled portion of the right-of-way of any road, street or within the Village during any snowfall where there has been a new accumulation of one inch (1") or more and for a period of twenty four (24) hours after the termination of said snowfall, or until snowplowing operations have been completed and all roads, streets and highways have been cleared to their full width, whichever first occurs. §9-2-3: PARKING RESTRICTIONS:

(A) No Parking:

No automobile or other self-propelled vehicle shall be parked within any part of the traveled portion of the right-of-way of any road, street or highway within the Village in the following places:

1. So as to block any road, street or highway, or so as to block any private driveway.
2. Within fifty feet (50') of any intersection.
3. Within twenty five feet (25') of any fire hydrant.
4. Within twenty five feet (25') of any traffic control or traffic information signs. (Ord. 67-12, 2-20-1967)
5. Within the right-of-way of State Route 59 within the corporate limits of the Village. (Ord. 76-115, 5-17-1976; amd. 2014 Code)

(B) Time Limit:

No parking shall be allowed on West Lake Shore Drive in the Village and on Summit Drive for a distance of one hundred feet (100') from any portion of Lot 97 in Tower Lake Park, a subdivision recorded as Document 258018, from eight o'clock (8:00) P.M. to ten o'clock (10:00) P.M. in December, January, February and March. (Ord. 70-46, 1-27-1970)

(C) Parking Prohibited:

No parking shall be allowed on the following Village streets, property or rights of way:

1. On the east side of East Lake Shore Drive between Melrose Drive and East Tower Drive.
2. On the south side of Melrose Drive between Devonshire Road and Oxford Road during the period from April 1 through October 31. (Ord. 81-201, 11-16-1981)
3. At the Graham Park Beach parking lot or the boat landing parking lot (both of which are located on the west side of East Lake Shore Drive between Melrose Drive and East Tower Drive) during the period from twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight to six o'clock (6:00) A.M. (Ord. 81-201, 11-16-1981; amd. 2001 Code)
4. Along Illinois Route 59 from Roberts Road to Indian Trail Road within the corporate limits of the Village of Tower Lakes. (Ord. 93-351, 2-15-1993)

(D) Private Property:

The parking on private property of vehicles and equipment not otherwise restricted or regulated by this Code shall occur only within a fully enclosed garage, or in an outdoor location which has an improved hard surface of pavement, brick or gravel and which is not on any septic system. (Ord. 00-454, 4-17-2000)

(E) Handicapped Parking:

A motor vehicle bearing registration plates issued to a handicapped person, as defined by Section 1-159.1 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, pursuant to Section 3-616 or to a disabled veteran pursuant to Section 3-609 or a special decal or device issued pursuant to Section 3-616 or pursuant to Section 11-1301-2 (all Sections of the Illinois Vehicle Code), or a motor vehicle registered in another jurisdiction upon which is displayed a registration plate, special decal or device issued by the other jurisdiction, designating the vehicle is operated by or for a handicapped person, shall be exempt from all provisions of this Code or rules and regulations adopted hereunder imposing time limitations on parking, except limitations of one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) hour or less, on any street or highway, or any parking lot or parking place which is owned, leased or owned and leased by the Village; but, such vehicle shall be subject to the laws which prohibit parking in "no stopping" and "no standing" zones in front of or near fire hydrants, driveways, public building entrances and exits, bus stops and loading areas, and is prohibited from parking where the motor vehicle constitutes a traffic hazard, whereby such motor vehicle shall be moved at the instruction and request of a law enforcement officer to a location designated by the officer. Parking privileges granted by this Section are strictly limited to the person to whom the special registration plates, special decal or device were issued and to qualified operators acting under his express direction while the disabled person is present.

No person shall use any area for the parking of any motor vehicle where prohibited pursuant to Section 11-1303 of the Illinois Vehicle Code or this Code or where an official sign controlling such area expressly prohibits parking at any time or during certain hours.

Any person convicted of a violation of this subsection (E) shall be fined not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for each offense, and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day a violation occurs or continues. (Ord. 2006-001, 1-16-2006)
